What does a nested network mean to you?

- A network hosted by a particular organization
- A network that hasn't yet taken off on its own
- A network within a larger infrastructure/organization
- A network within a network or a network of networks
- Association/'federation' evolved or developed over time; all 'members' relate to the national organisation, but not necessarily with each other
- Connections and support between individuals and organizations all with a common link to a central organization driving the network
- Eg. Alumni networks
- It is a new term/not sure

If you currently working within a nested network, what's top of mind for you?

- Competing for member's time and attention
- Promoting self-sufficiency/direction
- Issues around objectives, engagement, responsibilities
- Ensuring the network is participant driven
- Encouraging and facilitating partnership/collaborative working amongst the member agencies to knit the network together more
- Challenges in maintain cohesion and defining/tracking impact
- Cultivating a network mindset that is fluid, dynamic and synergistic; avoiding the static, fixed mindset that can be conjured around the term "network"
- Making the network visible and usable to itself. We're operating as a network on an unconscious level
- Sustainability

- How to transition institutional knowledge: buddy programmes, mentorship programmes, "alumni" events, Thinking Committee
- Offer people compensation. Set and ensure an equitable pay-scheme for members' engagement
- Combine different organisational structures. Structures might evolve over time, be flexible and adaptable. It's hard to say from the start which structure of governance will work best.
- How to balance the engagement and drive between the members and the hosted organisation?
- Authenticity: balance: being led by you but presenting things to you (members' busy schedules). Ensure good feedback mechanisms + share feedback back + do not over-consult the network
- Capacity is not static
