

## Do you consider your organization a "network of networks"?




#### Describe how your organization is a network of networks.

- We serve as a hub for multiple networks.
- We are a coalition of national networks of local governments and NGOs.
- We are developing a network which is partnering with other networks also focused on the same issue in similar communities.
- I have several network organisations who join me to share peer support and practice.
- We are a network lead partner and work within a network of partnering organizations, volunteer advisors, and community organizers. We are all weaved together in the work that we do.
- We participate in networks across scales.
- We convene community "hubs" and facilitate their identification of a goal and strategies relevant to their community. Each hub operates as a network (ideally) with a leadership team and working groups. The backbone is another institute.
- I work with a connector organization that seeks to connect networks globally for transformative change. We support hundreds of collective impact collaborative tables in different communities locally and globally.

- We are the regional support organization for groups, each with their own networks. We are in a unique position to assess the cultural landscape holistically by researching, conducting outreach to, and engaging these numerous, interconnected networks.
- Many of our members are leaders in their own networks.
- We work with individual and groups at the local, regional, and national level, building a network within each of those groups as well as role-specific networks to channel up into a national network.
- An alumni network of multiple programs over three decades. Cohorts within same program over repeated years.
- A coalition made up of many different networks!
- We have a strategy which connects multiple agendas, opportunities and needs across and within; communities, civil society, the state and businesses.
